

The 21st HANYU QIAO Chinese Proficiency Competition for University Students (Queensland Preliminaries)

The "Hanyu Qiao" Chinese Proficiency Competition for International University Students is a yearly international contest and is well-known in cultural and educational exchanges worldwide. This year will mark the 21st session of the competition. The 2022 Queensland Preliminary Competition, hosted by the Tourism Confucius Institute at Griffith University and supported by the Confucius Institute at The University of Queensland, will be held on May 28th via ZOOM. All the registered university students in Queensland are welcome to participate in the competition to showcase their Chinese language skills and understanding of Chinese culture.

Eligibility:

To be an eligible contestant, you need to be:

- An enrolled university or TAFE student in Queensland,
- A Non-Chinese national,
- Born and raised outside of China,
- Not speaking Chinese as your mother tongue

Note:

The **FIRST**-place winner in the Queensland Preliminary round will be one of the representatives on behalf of Australia to participate the international final.

The competition will be cancelled if the applicants are less than 5.

Divisions: Participants can choose BASIC DIVISION or ADVANCED DIVISION for registration:

- BASIC DIVISION applies to participants with short-term Chinese language learning experience or with relative levels of HSK 1-2.
- ADVANCED DIVISION applies to those with long-term Chinese language learning experience or with relative levels of HSK 3 or plus.

Competition Components: The Competition contains two parts: Chinese speech and Culture show covering 60% and 40% respectively.

Chinese Speech: (60%)

- Participant delivers a Chinese speech within 3 minutes with followed up questions from judges for no more than 2 minutes. This speech will be delivered via Zoom meeting **on May. 28**.
- Participants can choose their favorite topics for the speech based on the main theme "One World,

One Family”.

Culture Show: (40%)

- Participants can choose various culture and arts forms to present their understanding of Chinese culture, such as calligraphy, Chinese painting, Chinese song, Chinese style of dance, martial arts, paper cutting, tea arts and so on.
- Participants are supposed to submit a video of the culture show with time limit of 5 minutes. The video needs to be made in LANDSCAPE MODE.
- The video must be submitted to tci@griffith.edu.au before **12am May.23**. The late submission is not accepted.
